CROSSING THE U.S./CANADIAN BORDER

Customs and Immigration Information

U.S. and Canadian citizens aged 19 and over must present either a Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI)-compliant document (passport card, SENTRI, NEXUS, FAST, or U.S. Coast Guard Mariner Document) or proof of identity in the form of a government-issued photo ID (such as a driver's license) plus proof of citizenship such as a certified copy of a birth certificate. A U.S. or Canadian citizen aged 18 or younger who does not have any of the preceding documents may present only a certified copy of his or her birth certificate. (Members of the U.S. Armed Forces on active duty traveling on orders are exempt from the passport requirement. U.S. Military ID and a copy of the orders are required.) Citizens of all other countries require a valid passport and, in many cases, a visa obtained prior to arrival at the border. Passengers under 18 not traveling with both parents require a notarized letter from any parent not present giving permission to cross the border. Admission into either country is solely at the discretion of border authorities, and possession of required documentation in no way guarantees entry. When you make your cross-border reservation with either Amtrak or VIA Rail Canada, your date of birth, country of citizenship, and identification information will be required; this information is provided to border authorities. For further information and to determine what is required for your particular situation, contact the appropriate U.S. or Canadian government agencies prior to travel. WASHINGTON UNION STATION OPENED ITS DOORS!

When built, it was the largest train station in the world. The Washington Monument can lie within its concourse. It employed 5,000 people, and offered a Turkish Bath among other upscale amenities. Foreign dignitaries and U.S. Presidents used its facilities.

In 1988, it was restored and redeveloped into a modern multi-modal/mixed retail station and mall that attracts more visitors to Washington, D.C. than any other destination. With more than 130 unique shops and restaurants, it is the hub of Amtrak headquarters, as well as commuter railroads and motorcoach services.

In 2008, Union Station celebrates its centennial year. Be sure to visit its towering Beaux Arts Romanesque Main Hall and its shops and restaurants when you come to Washington. You will be glad you did.
