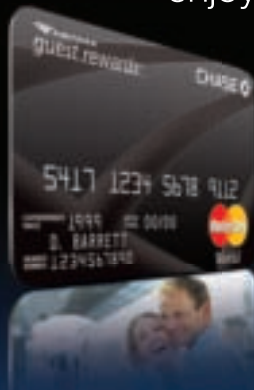
### CROSSING THE U.S./CANADIAN BORDER

#### Customs and Immigration Information

Persons crossing the border by land or sea, including on Amtrak trains and Thruway services, must have one secure Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative-compliant document that proves both citizenship and identity. For American citizens 16 and over, this document must be one of the following: passport, passport card, trusted travel card (NEXUS, SENTRI, or FAST), enhanced driver's license, merchant mariner document, military ID with military orders, or form I-872 (American Indian card). For Canadian citizens, one of the following is required: passport, trusted traveler card or an enhanced driver's license. For citizens of other countries, a passport, and in many cases a visa, is required. A passenger 15 and younger who does not have one of the above documents may present a certified copy of his or her birth certificate only. (Through May 30, 2009 only, a U.S. or Canadian citizen 19 and over who does not have one of the above documents may present a current non-enhanced driver's license and a certified copy of his or her birth certificate; if 18 and younger, a birth certificate only.) Passengers under 18 not traveling with both parents require a notarized letter from any parent not present giving permission to cross the border. Admission into either country is solely at the discretion of border authorities, and possession of required documentation in no way guarantees entry. When you make your cross-border reservation with either Amtrak or VIA Rail Canada, your date of birth, country of citizenship, and identification information will be required; this information is provided to border authorities. For further information and to determine what is required for your particular situation, contact the appropriate U.S. or Canadian government agencies prior to travel.

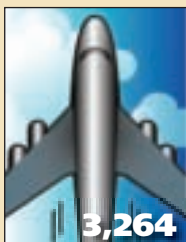
