### Service on the Pennsylvanian<sup>SM</sup>

- Coaches:** Reservations required except for travel locally between Philadelphia, Harrisburg and intermediate points.
- Business class:** Ticket price includes non-alcoholic beverages and newspaper.
- Lounge:** Sandwiches, snacks and beverages.
- No checked baggage:** Passengers may carry hand baggage on board.
- Wi-Fi available.

All Amtrak services and stations are non-smoking.
