B&P Tunnel Background

- The existing B&P tunnel connects West Baltimore MARC Station to Baltimore Penn Station and is over 150 years old
- The B&P tunnel carries 14 million passengers per year (Amtrak + MARC Penn Line)

Top Issues:

- Aging structure
- Frequent train delays through the tunnel
- High maintenance (frequent outages)
- No redundancy & resiliency




Current Program Construction Activity Areas



Utility Siphon Tunnel

- Short tunnel to carry utilities beneath the existing NEC railroad tracks
- Two vertical shafts connect the horizontal tunnel
- Temporary noise barrier walls are in place to help with construction noise





Storm Drain Relocation

- Relocating storm drain to accommodate future tunnel construction
- W Lafayette St 126" storm drain under construction
- Will connect on N Payson St in next 9 months
- Duration: Approximately 12 months





Upcoming Utility Relocations

- Contractors will close Rayner
 Ave between N Pulaski and
 N Payson Streets
- Work is to accommodate a 30" water line relocation
- We will maintain pedestrian access to all properties during construction
- Duration: Approximately 2 months






Location:

W Mulberry Street between N Warwick and N Smallwood St

Estimated Duration:


Approximately 18 – 24 months (mid – late 2027)

Details:

- Right in / right out movements
- Local traffic only areas
- Pedestrian (scooter) crossing locations
- Shifted bus stops within the corridor
- W Baltimore MARC parking lot access is maintained




W Mulberry St Road Closure Overview






W Mulberry St Road Closure Overview





Intersection N Warwick St and W Franklin St


- Eastbound traffic on W
 Mulberry St is reduced to
 2 lanes east of N Warwick
 Ave and diverted onto W
 Franklin St
- Eastbound traffic in the right lane must turn right onto N Warwick Ave
- Eastbound traffic in the left lane must turn left onto N Warwick Ave
- Traffic only has right in / right out access from the new access road to Price Busters





Intersection W Franklin St and Wheeler Ave


- Right in and right out only from the access road at Price Busters
- Eastbound traffic reduces from two lanes to one lane
- No left turn into
 Wheeler Ave from
 W Franklin St
 Eastbound





N Smallwood St between Franklin and Mulberry

- Right turn onto
 N Smallwood St from
 W Franklin St for
 transit vehicles and
 drivers accessing the
 ADA parking lot at the
 MTA only
- No left turns onto
 N Smallwood St off
 W Franklin St






W Franklin between N Pulaski and N Payson Sts

- Westbound traffic on W Franklin St must turn right at N Payson St and on N Pulaski St
- No left turns are permitted in any direction in this section
- No traffic can cross over W
 Franklin St going north or southbound

Key Takeaways About Construction

- Major utility relocation work is underway on the Program
- Traffic detours have started in the vicinity of West Baltimore MARC Station with the closure of W Mulberry Street
- Consider alternate travel paths to W Mulberry St and US 40 if your final destination is not near the MARC Station
- The Program team will come to meet with communities as requested to share updates and answer questions

Community Investment Program (CIP)



CIP Program Overview

- The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) approved the Program's new rail alignment in 2017
- As a part of that approval, FRA issued a Record of Decision (ROD) that outlined 43 mitigation measures to be implemented during the Program's construction
- The ROD mitigation measures included the establishment of the Community Investment Program (CIP)
- Amtrak has committed to an overall CIP budget of \$50 million



CIP Purpose & Objectives

Purpose:

■ To fund eligible organizations to complete eligible projects in the West Baltimore communities located within a ¼ mile of the Program alignment that are impacted by the Program (½ mile for transportation projects)

Objective:

To have a positive impact in the communities impacted by the Program




Key Considerations From CIP Development

- CIP funds governed by federal grant guidelines
- Listened to earlier community feedback and concerns
 - Fair, standardized process to apply for funds and evaluate proposals
 - Funding should address community-identified priorities where possible
 - Awards for multiple types of projects falling into 6 categories
 - Eligible organizations of any size can apply (small to large)



CIP Project Eligibility Criteria: Geography

- All projects must be located within ¼ mile of the new alignment (pink)
- Transportation projects may extend to ½ mile (blue)



CIP Eligibility Criteria: Organization Type

- Non-Profit 501c(3) Community Development Organizations
- Other not-for-profit organizations as defined by the IRS code 501(c)
- City and State government agencies with projects directly related to the mission of the CIP (includes quasi-governmental agencies)



CIP Project Categories

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Funding to offer community development and assistance services

1/4 mile of Program alignment

PARKS AND RECREATION

Maintenance, improvement or creation of publicly owned parks or recreational facilities

1/4 mile of Program alignment

OPEN SPACE

Improvement or establishment of community gardens, vacant lot reuse, and public open space

1/4 mile of Program alignment

TRANSPORTATION

Funding for streetscape infrastructure, pedestrian, and bicycle access improvements

½ mile of Program alignment

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Funding for local job training, workforce development, or other skill development programs

1/4 mile (Hub Targeted zip codes)

HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANT FUND*

\$2.75 million fund for building, site, or artifact rehabilitation or restoration

Applying for Community Grants

Identify project (initiative or operational need) Confirm project type and location and that the organization meets all eligibility criteria

Complete and submit application via Amtrak Grants Portal



Community Grant Application Details

- First Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) will be posted in late Fall
 - 2025 NOFO: October 1 December 5, 2025
- Applicants shall submit applications and supporting documentation via the Amtrak Grants Portal
- An Amtrak internal evaluation committee will review and score all properly submitted applications based on publicly available evaluation criteria
- Award notifications will be made no later than March 15, 2026

Community Grant Award Details

Launch Date	Fall 2025 (Oct 1 – Dec 5)
Award Sizes	 SMALL: \$1,000 to \$10,000 MEDIUM: \$10,001 - \$100,000 LARGE: \$100,001 - \$1,000,000 *75% of total funds available each annual NOFO cycle will be awarded to eligible not-for-profit organizations
Award Payments	 Reimbursable or Installment Payments
NOFO Publication Frequency	 Annually from 2025 until funds are depleted
Award Spending	 All spending must be completed within 1 year of award


