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Construction in Action: Recent Program Highlights

Progress across the Program area continues to gain momentum, with activities underway in several key areas. From relocating underground utilities to installing safety measures, crews are steadily completing each phase needed to keep the Program moving forward.

CONSTRUCTION OF THE SOUTH PORTAL

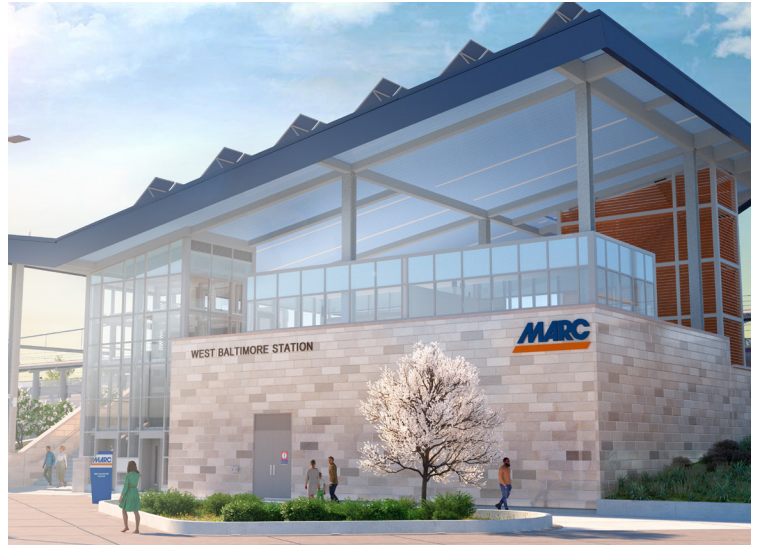
Work is progressing at the South Portal, where the team has begun preparing the tunnel boring machines (TBMs) launch pit. This 60-foot-deep trenched area will be excavated starting this summer. This launch pit will serve as the starting point for the TBMs that will actually dig the twin tubes of the new Frederick Douglass Tunnel. Once excavation is complete, crews will use the launch pit to lower the TBMs into position before major tunneling begins.

WEST BALTIMORE MARC STATION: BUS LOOP RELOCATION

As part of ongoing construction for the new West Baltimore MARC station, crews will begin constructing the new location of the Lot B bus loop in October 2026. During this period of construction, parking lots A, C, and D will remain open. The relocated Lot B bus loop, adjacent ADA parking, and West Mulberry Street railroad bridge are all anticipated to open in October 2027.

BRIDGE REPLACEMENT WORK

Bridge replacements are a critical part of the Program as we prepare for the Northeast Corridor's new track alignment.

West Mulberry Street Railroad Bridge

Work is continuing on the reconstruction of the railroad bridge over West Mulberry Street. In the coming months, crews will begin key activities on this bridge, including concrete placement and other bridge stabilization work. Once the railroad bridge is rebuilt, we will close West Franklin Street and begin similar construction activities on the railroad bridge over West Franklin Street. West Mulberry Street is expected to reopen in October 2027.

Lafayette Avenue Bridge Replacement

The Lafayette Avenue Bridge will be replaced in two phases, beginning with work on the east side of the bridge before shifting to the west side of the bridge.

During bridge construction, we will close Lafayette Avenue to traffic and temporarily relocate Lafayette and Payson Park. We will share more details on the relocation of the park as plans are finalized.

To help reduce disruptions for the surrounding community, we will be taking several steps in advance of the bridge closing. These steps include collecting traffic data to support street closures, providing shuttle bus service around the street and bridge closures for pedestrians, and installing directional signage to help guide travelers safely through the area impacted by this work. We are working with the Baltimore City Department of Transportation to help ensure safe and timely travel during construction.

North Portal Ventilation Facility

Work continues along McMechen Street near the MTA Light Rail Station where crews can be seen relocating utilities in preparation for the future North Ventilation Facility (NVF). Much of this work is happening

underground, but road users traveling through the area may still see flaggers guiding traffic along the roadway. Once complete, the NVF will play a critical role in tunnel safety by providing emergency ventilation and evacuation egress (exit routes) for the tunnel tubes.

Community Investment Program: Advancing the Process



Thank you to all the organizations that participated in the inaugural Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) application round for the Amtrak Community Investment Program (CIP). We were encouraged by the strong interest and engagement from organizations serving West Baltimore.

More than 200 attendees joined four information sessions designed to help applicants prepare complete submissions. With the NOFO application period now closed, we look forward to reviewing received proposals and awarding community grants.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Awardees for both Community Grants and the Historic Preservation Grant Fund Administrator role will be announced in Fall 2026. The next opportunity to apply for a Community Grant will be in spring 2027 during the next annual NOFO cycle. 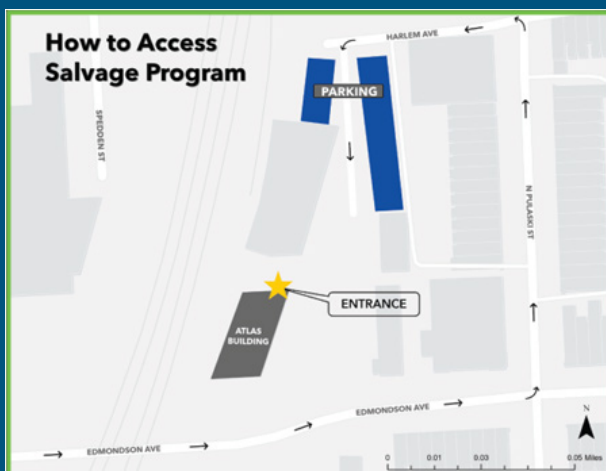

Strengthening Workforce Development Initiatives

Creating opportunities for West Baltimore residents remains an important part of the Program. With the launch of the Baltimore Workforce Hub in 2023, Amtrak committed to supporting this Baltimore Workforce Hub by adopting a local hiring preference for the Program.

As part of its commitment to workforce development, Amtrak has partnered with the Baltimore Mayor's Office of Employment Development and the Baltimore Workforce Funders Collaborative (part of the Maryland Philanthropy Network) to prepare interested residents for construction jobs and support career pathways in the rail and construction industries, aligning these efforts with Maryland's Raising the Bar initiative.

We look forward to working with our partners to continue expanding workforce development opportunities and access to union jobs for Baltimore residents.
