Amtrak Service & Ridership

Amtrak operates five National Network trains through Georgia:

- The **Auto Train** (daily Lorton-Sanford)*
- The **Crescent** (daily New York-Washington-Charlottesville-Charlotte-Atlanta-Birmingham-New Orleans)
- The **Palmetto** (daily New York-Washington-Richmond-Charleston-Savannah)
- The **Silver Meteor** (New York-Washington-Richmond-Charleston-Savannah-Jacksonville-Miami)
- The **Silver Star** (daily New York-Washington-Richmond-Columbia-Savannah-Jacksonville-Miami)

**The Auto Train does not stop in Georgia.*

Host Railroads & On Time Performance

Amtrak relies heavily on the cooperation of other railroads in order to operate routes using tracks that are not owned or controlled by Amtrak. Host railroads are statutorily required to provide Amtrak trains "preference" over freight transportation. However, on time performance on most host railroads is poor and continues to decline largely due to hosts ignoring their statutory responsibilities.

Listed below are the Amtrak services that operate in the Georgia with each service's host railroads and on-time performance (OTP) in FY19:

<i>Auto Train</i>	CSX and Florida Central Rail Corridor	75.0%
<i>Crescent</i>	Norfolk Southern	28.7%
<i>Palmetto</i>	CSX	62.8%
<i>Silver Meteor</i>	CSX, Florida Department of Transportation, and Florida Central Rail Corridor	49.4%
<i>Silver Star</i>	CSX, Norfolk Southern, Florida Department of Transportation, and Florida Central Rail Corridor	35.8%

“On-time performance” represents the percentage of stations at which the train arrives within 15 minutes of the scheduled arrival time.

Amtrak Guest Rewards

At the end of FY19, there were **86,248** members of the Amtrak Guest Rewards program in Georgia. This is a 11% increase from FY18.

Amtrak spent \$47,958,675 on goods and services in Georgia in FY19, including at:

Employment
